**SUBJECT: RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST**

**I. HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION AT 0600 PST AND OUTLOOK:**

- Flows in River Jhelum (at Mangla upstream) are likely to rise significantly, with a possibility to attain sharp peak up to medium flood level during 5<sup>th</sup> (night) to 7<sup>th</sup> October.
- Flows in the River Indus at Tarbela are also likely to increase slightly.
- Flows in the Ravi and Sutlej rivers will subject to release from India.
- Flows in the Kabul River are also expected to increase with chances of flash flooding in its tributaries.

**II. METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES:**

Yesterday's Cyclonic Storm (Shakhti) has moved westwards and today lies about 200km east of Masirah coast (Oman). Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over northern parts of Pakistan persists.

**III. WEATHER FORECAST FOR 48 HOURS:**

Widespread wind-thunderstorm/rain of moderate intensity (with isolated heavy to very heavy falls) is expected over upper Catchments of all major rivers along with Islamabad, Punjab and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.

Isolated thunderstorm/rain of light to moderate intensity is also expected over south and southeast Sindh.

**IV. WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR NEXT 72 Hours:**

Wet spell will gradually to subside.

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**SUBJECT: WEEKLY SIGNIFICANT WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR RIVERS' CATCHMENTS' (05<sup>th</sup> OCT-25 TO 11<sup>th</sup> OCT-25)**

**RAINFALL OUTLOOK**

**ALERT**

- A **Strong westerly weather system** is likely to affect upper Catchments of all major rivers along with Islamabad, Punjab and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa significantly (**heavy to very heavy** wind-thunderstorm/rain) from 5<sup>th</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup> of October 2025.

**FLOOD SITUATION IN MAJOR RIVERS**

- Flows in River Jhelum (at Mangla upstream) are likely to rise significantly, with a maximum up to Category-I flood level during 5th to 7th October.
- Flows in River Chenab may rise Medium to High Flood Level.
- Flows in the River Indus at Tarbela are also likely to increase to the Low Flood Level.
- Flows in the Ravi and Sutlej rivers will subject to release from India.
- Flows in the Kabul River are also expected to increase with chances of flash flooding in its tributaries.
- The possibilities of lightening in semi mountainous areas, land sliding in Gilgit Baltistan, Upper Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Kashmir and snowfall over the highest mountain peaks cannot be ruled out.
