SUBJECT: RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I. HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION AT 0600 PST AND OUTLOOK:

- Flows in River Jhelum (at Mangla upstream) are likely to rise , with a possibility to attain sharp peak up to medium flood level during next 24-hours.
- Flows in the River Sutlej and Ravi will subject to release from India (possibility of Low Flood Situation in River Sutlej at Ganda Singh Wala during next 24-Hours).

II. METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES:

Yesterday's Cyclonic Storm (Shakhti) today lies about 200km Southeast of Masirah coast (Oman).
Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over northern parts of Pakistan continues to persist.

III. WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24 HOURS:


Widespread wind-thunderstorm/rain of moderate intensity (with isolated heavy falls) is expected over upper Catchments of Rivers Jhelum , Chenab, Ravi & Sutlej along with Islamabad, Punjab and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.
Scattered thunderstorm/rain of light to moderate intensity is also expected over upper catchments of Rivers Indus & Kabul.

IV. WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR NEXT 48-Hours:

Wet spell is likely to subside gradually.



- Flows in River Jhelum (at Mangla upstream) are likely to rise, with a possibility to attain sharp peak up to medium flood level during next 24-hours.
- Flows in the River Sutlej and Ravi will subject to release from India ([possibility of Low Flood Situation in River Sutlej at Ganda Singh Wala](#) during next 24-Hours).
- The possibilities of lightening in semi mountainous areas, land sliding in Gilgit Baltistan, Upper Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Kashmir and snowfall over the mountain peaks cannot be ruled out.
