**SUBJECT: RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST**

**I. HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION AT 0600 PST AND OUTLOOK:**

- The River Indus at Kotri is in **Medium Flood**, whereas at Guddu and Sukkur is in **Low Flood Level**.
- River Sutlej at Ganda Singh Wala is in **Medium Flood**, whereas at Sulemanki and Islam is in **Low Flood Level**.
- The River Indus at Kotri is likely to remain in **Medium Flood Level** up to the end of this month.

**II. METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES:**

- Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over northwest Iran today lies over northwest Afghanistan.
- Seasonal low lies over northwest Balochistan

**III. WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24 HOURS:**

Mainly dry weather is expected.

**IV. WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR 72 Hours:**

Mainly dry weather is expected; however isolated thunderstorm/rain is expected over the upper catchments of Rivers Indus, Kabul and Jhelum during 24<sup>th</sup> to 25<sup>th</sup> September.

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**SUBJECT: WEEKLY SIGNIFICANT WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR RIVERS' CATCHMENTS' (23<sup>rd</sup> SEP-25 TO 29<sup>th</sup> SEP-25)**
