SUBJECT: RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I. HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION AT 0600 PST AND OUTLOOK:

- The River Indus at Kotri is in **Medium Flood**, whereas at Guddu and Sukkur is in **Low Flood Level**.
- River Sutlej at Ganda Singh Wala is in **Medium Flood**, whereas at Sulemanki and Islam is in **Low Flood Level**.
- The River Indus at Kotri is likely to remain in **Medium Flood Level** up to the end of this month.

II. METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES:

- Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over northwest Afghanistan today lies over Northeast Afghanistan.

III. WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24 HOURS:

Mainly dry weather is expected; however Isolated thunderstorm/rain is expected over the upper catchments of Rivers Indus and Kabul along with Islamabad and Rawalpindi division.

IV. WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR 48 Hours:

No significant change.
