**SUBJECT: RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST**

**I. HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION AT 0600 PST AND OUTLOOK:**

- The River Indus at Kotri is currently in **Medium Flood Level** and is expected to remain in Medium Flood Level uptill the end of the first week of October.

**II. METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES:**

- Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over northern parts of the country today lies over Kashmir and adjoining areas.
- A depression has developed over west Bay of Bengal and is expected to move in the Westward direction. At present none of the area of Pakistan is under any threat from it.

**III. WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24 HOURS:**

Isolated thunderstorm/rain is expected over the upper catchments of Rivers Indus and Kabul.  
Mainly dry weather is expected for the rest of the country.

**IV. WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR 48 Hours:**

Mainly dry weather.
