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SUBJECT: RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I: HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST

All the major rivers are flowing below low flood level.

II: METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- a) Yesterday's trough of westerly wave over northern parts of country has moved away eastwards.
- b) Yesterday's depression weakened into well marked low, moved westwards and today lies over northeast Madhya Pradesh.
- c) Mild moist currents from the Bay of Bengal are penetrating the upper catchments of rivers Sutlej, Ravi and Chenab up to 5000 feet.

III: WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24-HOURS

Mainly dry weather is expected over the most parts of the country. However, isolated thunderstorm rain of light intensity is expected over the upper catchments of all the major rivers along with Gujranwala and Bahawalpur divisions.

IV: WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR NEXT 48-HOURS

No significant change.
